

PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE (PNC) REPORT

Your Pastor Nominating Committee was elected by the congregation in October 2024 to begin the process of calling a new pastor to FPCV. Using the congregational survey and the Mission Study, the PNC committee constructed a profile and description of our Church that was posted on the Presbyterian website that notifies all Presbyterian Pastors seeking a new calling about our available Pastor's position.

The way it works is like this: A Potential Pastor candidate's profile is matched to our Church's profile according to similar compatibility. Our Church's PNC then reads the candidate's profile and decides to invite them to apply if we decide they are a good potential candidate. The candidate can either accept our invitation to apply or decline the invitation accordingly.

It is important for the congregation to understand that this process takes time, and we are restricted by the rules of Presbytery. Your PNC has been meeting weekly and we are working diligently to move the process along as quickly as possible but we are committed to finding the best candidate possible for our new Pastor.

So far, your PNC has conducted 3 interviews and has reviewed many profiles to consider.

In the meantime, Debbie Michelsen has been working hard with the pulpit supply at Presbytery to schedule guest Pastors to lead us through Easter and longer if necessary.

Your PNC asks that you keep the search committee in your prayers. God has already chosen the new Pastor for our Church, our committee but needs to discern his will and bring us together.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE



The weekly Sunday School lessons continue to be linked to the worship service. Each week the Pulpit supply individual lets the Sunday School teachers know what the scripture and sermon title is and the lessons are prepared from them. The older class begins each lesson by understanding who the author of each of the scriptures was to understand the context of what the passages are telling us. Their understanding is evident in the deep questions they ask and the connections that they are making to what they

learn in history at school and how the passages guide our decisions on a weekly basis.

Our children participated in Souper Bowl Sunday take 2 when it was postponed due to snow and church was called off on the actual Super Bowl Sunday. Their enthusiasm was not deterred by the delay and they participated in a short skit about Souper Bowl Sunday, all coming dressed for the occasion. We collected 37 cans of soup and \$225 which all went to the Holy Spirit Episcopal Church's food pantry in town. Our totals were given to the national organization *Souper Bowl of Caring*[™]. Thank you to Dick Crawford for bringing all the cans of soup to the pantry.

In other ministry work by the Sunday School, as of the submission of this newsletter, they have counted



a total of 207 pairs of socks for those less fortunate in our 7th annual sock drive. There is 1 week to go, so the final count will be after printing of the newsletter. This year they began to insert notes into each pair of socks or taped to each multipack of socks saying "God loves you" to let the people know that they matter to God and to us. The children lovingly counted the pairs of socks, placed the notes inside and gave bags to Ms. Liz Greene to take to Betsy's Closet in Newark to distribute to those in need. Our youth are learning and living the teachings of Jesus Christ in their lessons and the ministry projects through the year. We have others coming up in the spring too so the learning never stops. As you stroll down to the parlor, please look at all of the work that the children are making and sharing with everyone about the teachings of Jesus Christ and how to be good followers of him.

We are gearing up for the annual Good Friday Workshop in April. Some of

our regular volunteers have been sidelined, so we are looking for some additional volunteers to help out. The day is well organized with strong communication and guidance for anyone who wants it. Please consider helping our youth develop relationships with all of our church members through helping out in some way with this morning event (10am – 12:30 pm).

Our adult offerings for Bible/book study are on hold without a permanent pastor however, if anyone is interested in initiating one, please speak with Cathy Franco.

PLANSOEN GRANT

Once again, the First Presbyterian Church of Verona received a significant grant of \$ 50,000 for use in 2025 from the Plansoen Foundation. For many years, the Foundation has offered an opportunity for us to apply for a grant. In the past and currently, the Church has requested funds for continuing support of the music program including concerts, professional musicians especially during Worship Services, maintenance of the organ and other musical instruments, and children's programs.

Previous grants have enabled restoration of the stage in 2019, new doors including an ADA- compliant door and an exterior walkway for Chamberlain Hall, completed in 2024, and support for food kitchens especially during the pandemic. Currently, funds are being used to add a much-needed ADA bathroom across the hall from Chamberlain Hall.

We are most grateful for this amazing support, all started many years ago because of the close connection of Charlotte Cunningham, former Music Director, and the Plansoen Foundation.
