Kyle Blackburn is a multi-faceted music educator and performer based in New Jersey. Kyle is regularly seen teaching everything from choir to music technology across the state. When not teaching, Kyle can be found working as a collaborative pianist for various organizations along with work across the greater New Jersey area as a music director, voice teacher, and vocalist.

James Shorten has been a huge help by returning as our Interim Sexton while he is home on winter break from College. He will be with us until 1/22/25 when he returns to school. The work of James and our many volunteers who have been pitching in to keep the buildings in good shape have been supplemented by students from West Orange High School. The students are in the work training program for those between 18-21 years old and are under the supervision of their Special Education Teacher and Job Coaches. This new ministry of the church provides the students with real life work training opportunities which the church is not allowed to pay for per the guidelines of the State of NJ. If you see these hard working students, please let them know they are appreciated.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Our Christmas Children's Workshop was another annual success with some new volunteers joining our seasoned ones. Thanks to all for their invaluable help in creating a fun learning experience for the children.

Happy New Year to everyone. Christian Education had another busy year helping our youth and adults grow in their faith under Reverend Dr. Rhonda Meyer's guidance. While we are sad to have said our good-bye's to her, she has left an indelible impression with us on how we conduct Christian Education for all. The children made her a mobile with words describing how they will remember her. They found her to be smart, kind, funny, a good story teller, calm, and nice. Riley and Cathy will continue to weave scriptures into the Sunday School lessons following the Presbyterian Lectionary for this year until a new Pastor is called to further guide us.

In the absence of a regular Pastor, the Christian Education Committee will work closely with Worship & Music (who arranges for pulpit supply) as well as our new Music Director Kyle to coordinate upcoming special Sundays and practice for those children interested in singing.

When our Pulpit Supply person chooses not to do the Children's Message, Cathy or Riley will take it on so that the children continue to gain comfort with being included in the service each week.

On Communion Sunday's we will have a slight change on children's participation. The older class will break from Sunday School lesson and continue to join the congregation for Communion, however our younger class will stay upstairs.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS

There are still a few projects left over from 2024 that will be addressed in 2025.

ADA Bathroom: As of this writing, the bathroom is about 90% done. The sink, toilet and grab bars are yet to be installed. These things should be accomplished during January.

Fire in Chamberlain Hall: A small fire occurred in the wall of the stage in December. It was quickly put out by our local fire department personnel, but there is now a hole in the wall. Our Insurance Company, Church Mutual, and Serve-Pro are negotiating a settlement. Then, work will be done to repair the opening, and electrical plug in the wall, clean and revarnish the stage, wax the hall floor and possibly clean the curtains and drapery.

After the Myers move out of the manse in mid-January, an inspection will be done. The attic fan motor will need to be replaced also.

There is now a second Memorial Plaque by the church main entrance. It was expertly mounted by Bob Prout and his carpenters. A big "Thank You" goes out to them for an excellent job.

James Shorten will be with us through late January. During his time here he will be doing cleaning, garbage removal and other jobs as they come up. He is very conscientious about keeping the church in good shape.

PLANSOEN GRANT

Once again, the First Presbyterian Church of Verona received a significant grant of \$50,000 for use in 2025 from the Plansoen Foundation. For many years, the Foundation has offered an opportunity for us to apply for a grant. In the past and currently, the Church has requested funds for continuing support of the music program including concerts, professional musicians especially during Worship Services, maintenance of the organ and other musical instruments, and children's programs.

Previous grants have enabled restoration of the stage in 2019, new doors including an ADA- compliant door and an exterior walkway for Chamberlain Hall, completed in 2024, and support for food kitchens especially during the pandemic. Currently, funds are being used to add a much-needed ADA bathroom across the hall from Chamberlain Hall.

We are most grateful for this amazing support, all started many years ago because of the close connection of Charlotte Cunningham, former Music Director, and the Plansoen Foundation.
